Dear Mayor Hepkins:

It is my pleasure to present to you and Council the Police Department's Monthly Report for the services performed by the members of the Yeadon Police Department for the period July 1-31, 2018.

General Information. Information is a vital part of being able to provide answers to residents that can help others understand the dynamics of law enforcement, activities that occur daily to make a community safe, as well as associated costs dynamic to public safety. This report contains information obtained from the Department's Alert2 Information Records System, as well as personal insight related to daily operations of the Police Department. Instead of providing you with just totals, I wanted to provide you with reports that provide more information to better understand what goes on in the Borough, and the work of the personnel in the Department, which includes police, parking enforcement, and school crossing guards.

Crime Prevention.

- **#MissionLockItUp** continues to generate interest and participation in the Borough.
- I have spoken with and am working with the owner of the bar located in Upper Darby that is affecting the quality of life for residents in the area of Penn and 1St Streets. This is an ongoing matter, and enforcement activity as well as the compliance of the owner with my suggestions to curb late night disruptions is working, but still needs improvement.
- ATV and Off-Road Cycle activity has taken a hit with four seized motorcycles being caught with the operators charged accordingly. This is a problem in the Borough and area wide which creates a major safety issue for not only pedestrians and motorists, but the operators as well. There is a ZERO Tolerance for these offenses.

Safety Tip – ATV and Off-Road Cycle Activity. Individuals who operate these vehicles on public highways do so more often than not illegally with no regard for the public and/or their own safety. With that said, I have an ongoing effort to identify and deter these reckless operators from thinking that Yeadon is a place to perform their stunts. I offer the following few tips for pedestrians and motorists to consider if they hear or see such activity to help protect them from potential harm.

- Obey traffic laws. My point here is to stop at stop signs, don't anticipate green lights, take a sec, just one sec before entering an intersection to make sure one of these type of vehicles are not racing through, because more often than not they don't stop for signs, lights or other traffic.
- I do not authorize Yeadon Officers to pursue these offenders, unless there is a serious felony involved in the incident, as the potential for harm to the operator or public is too great. So, if you see an approaching police vehicle, yield by pulling over and stopping until the pursuit passes.

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- Do not anticipate where the cyclist may go and think you can turn the other way or move out of the way faster. Your safest bet is to pull to the side of the road and stop.
 - If involved in any type of accident with these offenders, stay locked in your car and call 911 for police.
 - Don't leave the scene of any accident just because they might do so.
 - When walking don't jaywalk. Cross at intersections. Again listen and LOOK before crossing.
 - Don't anticipate you can get across a roadway faster than an approaching cyclist or ATV.
 - If you know of locations where these operators are getting together, storing their equipment, or creating issues call 911 or even anonymously email us with information. Your information may not just save a life, but your own as well.
 - If you own an ATV or Dirt bike, *lock it up*, these vehicles are frequently stolen.

Traffic Citations issued: 57

Based on a review of the areas that present repeated problems, complaints from the public, or officers and/or my observations, directed traffic patrols will be continued for resident, pedestrian, and motorists safety. Major violations continue to revolve around stop sign violations.

Non-Traffic Citations issued: 15

The most common offense for the month was disorderly conduct, with an additional 25 instances where warnings were given in lieu of a citation by officers.

Police Department Activity.

1. New Child ID kits are available for free to residents. These kits feature a Yeadon Patch and offer parents peace of mind having important information related to their children such as fingerprints, DNA, hair, and dental record information. I am bringing these kits to the schools as well as a new gun safety program.
2. I have teamed up with the Eddie the Eagle Gun Safety Program, which provides FREE information, kits, and materials for gun safety education for parents and kids. Officers will be bringing this program to the schools as they continue my walk-thru directives
3. National Night Out plans were finalized for Tuesday, August 7, 2018.
4. Promoting Yeadon through the use of my twitter account @ChiefChachi_YPD and Nextdoor continues.
5. Attended the monthly Public Safety meeting.

6. Four new part-time police officers were privately sworn in by the Mayor, and are to formally sworn in. This activity could not wait until the actual council meeting as I needed the manpower for the summer months. All of the officers have successfully passed the rigorous interview and background investigations to become Yeadon Officers.
 7. The Body Cam Program training has been scheduled, and residents will see them in use before the end of August. Policy and procedures for their use are in place.
 8. Public Safety Presentation for residents – Identity theft and Scams is scheduled for the Mayor’s Forum and at Friendship Circle in September.
 9. The Department participated in regional DUI Roving Patrols. (OT costs for all officers involved and those working the street to supplement our involvement are reimbursed by a grant).
 10. Youth Police Academy applications and flyers are out. The program is offered to all High School Students of the William Penn School District. One of the differences I have planned for the kids is getting them certified in CPR.
 11. An adult Citizens Police Academy is planned and the announcement and start date are predicated on the Youth Police Academy interest.
 12. A review of parking ticket requires some thinking. My suggestion is with the potential of thousands of dollars in revenue being gained, hiring a part-time clerk to handle this task, maybe offer amnesty with original or reduced fines, explore on-line payment options, or pursue vehicle wheel boots for habitual offenders, with the costs for the clerk, or equipment being offset with the positive revenue gained from clearing up the hundreds of unpaid parking tickets identified through my department review.
 13. New Home and Personal Safety Surveys are available to the public.
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Police Training.

1. Mandatory In-Service Training, as well as other training continues which includes:
 - a. Firearms requalification.
 - b. First Aid/CPR.
 - c. Body Cam Usage/Training
 - d. Speed device re-certs.
 - e. DUI Checkpoint Re-certs.
 - f. SWAT training (Firearms, Entry Tactics, etc.)
 - g. Investigative Training for Patrol Officers (Inter-County Detective School).

Training is a vital aspect of a professional police agency, and ongoing education and training will be afforded officers to promote officer development and a quality of service to the public second to none.

Recruitment, Hiring, Promotional Examinations

1. Interviews for Part-Time Police Officer positions are currently on hold as I have achieved a full complement of part-time officers.
2. Discussions with the Civil Service Commission Chair to prepare a promotional test and a full-time police officer test continues.

Home and Personal Safety

The Yeadon Police Department actively patrols your neighborhood. However, we can't be everywhere. Crime Prevention works when a partnership exists between citizens and the police. In addition to never hesitating to report suspicious or criminal activity, securing your home and being aware of your surroundings can reduce the chances of you becoming a victim of crime. Take the time to answer all of the questions in this survey. If you are able to answer yes to each question; *nice job*, because you are taking home and personal safety seriously. If you answer no, to any of these questions, please take the steps to learn or ask a police officer what you can do to improve your safety and the security of your home. We are here for you. All you have to do is ask.

Is your home an easy target?

- 1. Is your house number visible from the street, with numbers at least 3" high?
- 2. Can your neighbors see your home? If they can't; we can't, but burglars will.
- 3. Do you know your neighbors, and those who live there?
- 4. Are your trees, bushes, plants, pruned to prevent hiding places near windows/doors?
- 5. Do you have a privacy fence? Looks nice, but burglars love the ability to hide.
- 6. Do you have motion lights on, or leave lights on in the front and back, home or not?
- 7. Do you lock your doors and windows whenever you leave, regardless of how long?
- 8. Do you leave keys hidden outside? If you answer yes, don't tell me, just go get them.
- 9. Do you lock your attached/detached garage and/or shed?
- 10. Do any locks you use deter excess force or the use of bolt cutters to defeat the lock?
- 11. Have you actually walked around your property to determine how a burglar might get in?
- 12. Live in an apartment? Do you notify management when lights, locks, or other security issues are not working?
- 13. Do you report suspicious conditions, persons, or crimes you see when they are happening?
- 14. Do you know about and participate in Yeadon's #MissionLockItUp program?

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Doors and Windows

1. Are your doors/locks solid enough to withstand a burglar's pry bar or shoulder?
2. Is any glass or window within 36 inches (arm's reach) of your door's lock?
If so, reinforce or remove them.
3. Do your patio or French double doors have a deadbolt into a stationary door, that is secured by header and threshold bolts into metal strikes plates. These doors are typically weak due to all the glass, consider a device to add some additional security, such as a door security bar.
4. Do you use extra security devices/measures for your sliding glass doors? Sliding glass doors need extra security against prying and lifting. A charley bar, broom handle, cut piece of 2 by 2 framing wood can prevent unwanted opening. You can also use screws into the top track, backed out to just clear the top of the door, to prevent lifting the door out of the track.
5. Is there a wide-angle viewer installed in your front / back doors? If so can your kids reach it?
6. Do you lock the doors going into the garage from your house or yard?
7. Do you lock your garage, even if you're home?
8. Do your exterior basement doors have extra protection?
9. Do your basement windows work properly and lock?
10. Do you lock ALL of your windows whenever you leave your home?
11. Do you shut your blinds and curtains when you leave?

Home Security and Safety

1. New home? Have you had all your door locks re-keyed or replaced?
2. Do you have a home security system, which you actively use? Remember this will not stop a burglar, it will only hurry them, if they decide to enter your home regardless of sound/signs.
3. Do you have a security camera system that you actively use?
4. Do you use automatic timers on lights; TV's, and radios in your home?
5. Do you ask trusted neighbors to watch your house if you are going to be gone over night?
6. Do you ask a trusted neighbor to pick up newspaper, mail, and deliveries when you are away?
7. Do you ask your neighbor to maintain you lawn or remove snow when gone for vacation, etc.?
8. Do you have your neighbor park an extra car in your driveway when you are away?

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- 9. Does your home look “like someone’s home” even if you aren’t?
 - 10. Do you alert your Police Department when you are going away, so we can do spot checks?
 - 11. Do you provide info to a neighbor or police for whom to call in an emergency when away?
 - 12. Have you recorded/photo’d the make, model, and serial numbers of all of your valuables?
 - 13. Do you actively check your bank accounts for potential fraud and know who to call to cancel credit and/or bank cards, if lost or stolen?
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Personal Safety

- 1. When walking, do you present an alert and confident appearance; are you aware of people and your surroundings? *Appear timid and unaware, criminals will consider you a target.*
- 2. When possible do you walk near the curb facing traffic, avoiding shrubbery, dark doorways, and other places of concealment? *Avoid shortcut, alleys, and unfamiliar areas with little pedestrian or other traffic present.*
- 3. Do you carry items such as purses firmly, and avoid leaving them unattended, in a shopping cart, or on the back of a chair while out? *Thieves will distract you while a second thief walks off with your belongings.*
- 4. Are you familiar with police stations, hospitals, stores, and gas stations that are open at night that can provide access to safety if needed?
- 5. Do you know that wearing headphones can distract you, and make you unable to potentially recognize danger whether its criminals, traffic, or other hazards while walking?
- 6. Do you always lock your car while driving and when you get out?
- 7. Before you enter your vehicle, do you look around, have your keys ready, and look inside to ensure it is clear?
- 8. Do you have a working flashlight in your car?
- 9. Do you put all packages in your trunk instead of your back seat, unless you’re headed home?
- 10. Have you taught your kids what to do and how to ask for help in an emergency?
- 11. Have your taught your kids what to do if you’re out and you get separated?
- 12. If you possess a firearm, do you responsibly secure it when home so kids won’t access it, and taught your kids about gun safety? *Need a gun lock? Stop at Yeadon PD for a free one!*
- 13. Have you taught your kids about bullying?
- 14. Have you taught your kids about alcohol/drug abuse?
- 15. Have you gotten your free Child ID Kit for peace of mind? *Stop at Yeadon PD for one!*

Yeadon Police Home / Personal Safety Assessment

This home/personal security/safety survey can help you identify weaknesses in your security that may provide an opportunity for a criminal to make you a victim of crime. While nothing can make your home completely burglar proof, or help you absolutely avoid crime; if you follow simple advice, stay aware and informed, and actively take personal protection seriously, you CAN give yourself an edge in staying safe.

A community is not safe just because the police make a lot of arrests. A community is safe when the residents work together with police to deter and prevent crime by creating an atmosphere for minimal chances of successful criminal conduct to occur in the mindset of criminals. This happens when you take personal safety seriously; speak up, report suspicious and criminal activity, and look out for one another.

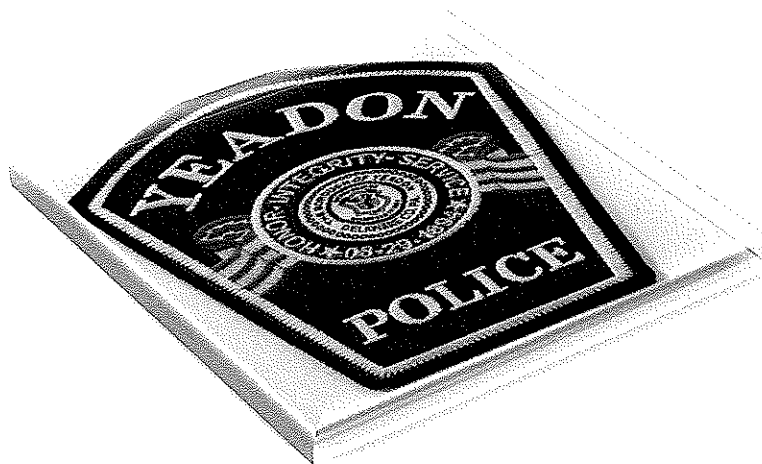
