Dear Mayor Hepkins:

It is my pleasure to present to you and Council the Police Department's Monthly Report for the services performed by the members of the Yeadon Police Department for October 01-31, 2018.

General Information. Information is a vital part of being able to provide answers to residents that can help others understand the dynamics of law enforcement, activities that occur daily to make a community safe, as well as associated costs dynamic to public safety. This report contains information obtained from the Department's Alert2 Information Records System, as well as personal insight related to daily operations of the Police Department. This information can help one to better understand what goes on in the Borough, and the work of the personnel in the Department, which includes police, parking enforcement, clerical staff, and school crossing guards.

Crime Prevention.

#MissionLockItUp continues to generate interest and participation in the Borough and nearby jurisdictions. Weatherproof reflective stickers are HERE!!! These items will help get the message out and remind residents. The program made it on a news story for FOX29 and is getting Yeadon noticed. I've been dropping stickers off to residents during my patrols.



- Unmarked Police vehicles are in the process of being outfitted to add an increased presence of officers on the street, and reduce the ability of offenders to see us coming. Obviously I can't describe the cars but they are coming.
- Yeadon Police are now active members of the Delaware County District Attorney's Drug Task force. Recently, we received a check for over \$19,000.00 that was a result of a seizure of drugs in the Borough.
 - o These crimes are actively being investigated.
 - o The message will be Yeadon is not a safe place to sell your drugs in town.

Safety Tip: Deer. Yes, deer. This is the time of year that residents need to be aware of the dangers posed by deer during the breeding season. As an example, I recently responded to a complaint about deer in the front yards on Rose Street. While moving the deer, a large buck attacked another deer and aggressively came towards me before running off. Police moved the deer in an attempt to get them back to woods. This was at 0800 in the morning, and with students enroute to school and motorists headed to work the potential for harm is greatly increased.

- 1. Shouting, clapping, use of your horn or car alarm will move deer along in most cases.
- 2. Avoid the bucks, these are the males and have antlers.

- 3. Dusk and dawn are the highest times for potential to have an accident with a deer crossing roadways, BUT during the breeding season from late October to late November this could be all day.
- 4. If you have accident report it, it helps us determine areas for signage for example, as well as the need for your insurance company.
- 5. Deer carry ticks, when walking through woods or after being in your yard, check yourself thoroughly for ticks, if possible save the removed tick to be tested for Lyme. If you get a bullseye type rash get checked. This disease can be debilitating. Usually starts with flu like symptoms that are severe.

The deer program is moving along. Police Officers are the only registered hunters in the Borough using Archery only, no firearms are allowed. So far we have discovered and removed three illegal hunters who would surreptitiously enter the woods. One hunter was located entering the Cemetery to hunt which is illegal. If you are unsure if it's a police officer call our station 610-623-1500 or 911 and an officer can check or let you know it is an officer hunting for the program. A report will be made when the program is over. So far about a dozen residents are permitting officers access to woods through their properties. Need more info contact me at apaparo@yeadonpd.org.

 - i. A Juvenile Petition is an arrest of a juvenile offender that results in a Criminal Record being generated. A Petition is for a felony or misdemeanor offense, which the juvenile has been charged with, and the District Attorney has reviewed and approved related charges.

Traffic Citations issued: 80

Based on a review of the areas that present repeated problems, complaints from the public, or officers and/or my observations, directed traffic patrols will be continued for resident, pedestrian, and motorists safety. Major violations continue to revolve around stop sign violations and speed, especially school zones.

Non-Traffic Citations issued: 20

The most common offense for the month was disorderly conduct.

Police Department Activity.

- 1. Attended the Public Safety Meeting, which was brief due to unforeseen circumstances.
- 2. Attended the Safe Schools Conference.
- 3. Work in progress for a larger power generator for storm power related issues.
- 4. Football season continues, and at least 4 more additional games are in the works.
 - a. Officers provide safety while PWHS Patriots play under the Friday night lights.
 - b. There have been some fights after the games prompting extra police and patrols.

- c. The school district pays for these extra officers at the games.
- d. I have been in contact with the district and have added 2 officers to each game (6).
- 5. The Department continues to participate in regional DUI Roving Patrols. (OT costs for all officers involved and those working the street to supplement our involvement are reimbursed by a grant).
 - a. Yeadon is up next for an actual DUI Checkpoint. This is paid for by a grant.
- 6. Youth Police Academy has one week of instruction left. Nine (9) students are participating, and will receive their certificates at the November 15, 2018 Council Meeting.
- 7. Deer management initiatives are underway, several residents have joined the program, and others are still filtering in.
 - **a.** There have been no issues.
 - **b.** Officers have caught three illegal hunters in the woods during regular patrols, not while hunting!
- 8. Officers continue patrols of the schools.
- 9. Grant paid related traffic enforcement details continue in high violation incident areas.
- 10. New cars will be visible by November 15, 2018. New design and color scheme!
 - **a.** These changes were paid for with funds from selling three older police cars and an insurance check for one car from an accident.
 - **b.** I am working with a body shop, which is not only painting the cars, but fixing any dents for only \$500 a car. I had an initial estimate of \$1200.00 a car, and that was without any body work completed!
- 11. Attended the Yeadon Community Day event, Yeadon Police had a table for residents to get info. etc.
- 12. Officers attended the Trunk or Treat festivities at Bell School.

Police Training.

- 1. Mandatory In-Service Training, as well as other training continues which includes:
 - a. Firearms and Rifle requalifications.
 - b. First Aid/CPR.
 - c. DUI Checkpoint Re-certs.
 - d. SWAT training (Firearms, Entry Tactics, etc.)
 - i. Helicopter training

Training is a vital aspect of a professional police agency, and ongoing education and training will be afforded officers to promote officer development and a quality of service to the public second to none.

Recruitment, Hiring, Promotional Examinations

- 1. Interviews for Part-Time Police Officer positions are currently are in progress.
- 2. I am looking at the potential of having 3-4 new officers wear a Yeadon Uniform for their graduation in December.
 - a. One of the candidates is an African American Female!
- 3. Discussions with the Public Safety Committee on promotional and police officer testing changes to the Civil Service Rules continue.
