Borough's Emergency Management Response/Disaster Recovery: In March of 2018, the Borough experienced ice and wind storms that tore down trees and power lines, resulting in blackouts that lasted for weeks in some areas of the Borough. Additionally, Borough Hall itself experienced outages where Police, Fire and First Responders were locked out of the building without power. As a result, Public Safety learned many lessons. Among other things, we're currently embarking on an emergency generator for the building and an emergency disaster plan. Residents will be brought up to date as we move along to mitigate these concerns.

Last Mayor's Forum was held on December 6, 2018. Next Mayor's Forum will be held on March 7. Mayor's Forums are usually held on the first Thursday of the quarter at 7 pm at Borough Hall. This year's schedule is as follows: March 7; June 6; September 5; December 5.

This month marks the one year anniversary of Chief Paparo becoming our Chief of Police.

In such a short time, Chief Paparo, aka Chachi, has really made his presence felt. Among the positive changes are: new strategic partnership with our schools and the police department, Yeadon's own police youth academy, newly designed police patches, newly designed police cars, and #MissionLockitup has become a regional sensation, generating great media attention.
