Dear Mayor Hepkins:

It is my pleasure to present to you and Council the Police Department's Monthly Report for the services performed by the members of the Yeadon Police Department for January 01-31, 2019.

**General Information.** Information is a vital part of being able to provide answers to residents that can help others understand the dynamics of law enforcement, activities that occur daily to make a community safe, as well as associated costs dynamic to public safety. This reflects the work of the personnel in the Department, which includes police, parking enforcement, clerical staff, and school crossing guards.

### Crime Prevention.

- **#MissionLockItUp** continues to generate interest and participation in the Borough and nearby jurisdictions.
  - Nether Providence Police have copied the program but call it "Lock It or Lose It".
- **CSI or 'Cam Saw It' Camera Program.** A new Resident/Business Camera Registration Program, is out and we are actively seeking residents and business registrations to assist in crime deterrence and investigation. A copy of the application is attached.
  - Darby Twp. Police liked the idea and is pitching this to their residents as well.



- Plainclothes patrols are occurring in the Borough.
- Safety tips and public interaction continues with Nextdoor.

**Safety Tip:** I'm reiterating last month's tip. We have seen a major increase in stolen cars this month, as people STILL continue to run their cars especially in the morning to warm them up to come out and find it missing. So please spread the word on this, don't become a victim so easily.

It's cold outside right. Want to get into a warm car right? Just going to start it and come back in a few minutes after its toasty inside, right? WRONG. You're inviting a thief to take your car. Most stolen cars nowadays are a result of this scenario playing out. Did you think that it might not just be the person walking down the street who sees the opportunity, but a car with multiple occupants on a morning drive through the area looking for the telltale signs of steam/smoke coming from the cold engine exhaust? You come out your car is gone. The same thing for a stop at WAWA, or any other store, turn your car off, take the keys, and keep the car yourself, don't give a thief an opportunity to just easily take it. Think smart! BE SAFE!

    - i. A Juvenile Petition is an arrest of a juvenile offender that results in a Criminal Record being generated. A Petition is for a felony or misdemeanor offense, which the juvenile has been charged with, and the District Attorney has reviewed and approved related charges.


**Traffic Citations issued: 101**

Based on a review of the areas that present repeated problems, complaints from the public, or officers and/or my observations, directed traffic patrols will be continued for resident, pedestrian, and motorists safety. Major violations continue to revolve around stop sign violations and speed, especially school zones.

**Non-Traffic Citations issued: 23**

The most common offense for the month was disorderly conduct.

**Police Department Activity.**

1. A Yeadon Police Officer was officially sworn in as a member of the
2. The Adult Citizens Police Academy is set for February 27, 2019.
  - a. A copy of the application is attached to this report.
  - b. My plan is to award Graduates their Certificates at the April 18, 2019 Council Meeting.

4. The Deer Management Program ended on Saturday, January 26, 2019.
  - a. There have been zero issues. **THANK YOU** to the residents for their participation.
  - b. Final deer count is at: 3 Bucks, 27 does, 4 does that succumbed to vehicle collisions and 8 does (yearlings) have been found deceased in the woods (1 inside the deer fence) most likely due to starvation and/or extreme conditions.
    - i. Total count of all removed during Oct 15, 2018 to Jan 26, 2019 (42 deer)
    - ii. Each doe potentially could birth 2-3 fawns, so essentially 54-81 potential fawns have been prevented from increasing the population just from the deer harvested.
    - iii. Venison has been distributed to local families and St Lewis Church.
    - iv. The program is working, but will take a couple years to get the population under control to begin to limit damage to residents landscaping, and potential vehicle collisions.
    - v. Unreported accidents probably accounted for at least 5 different deer observed with broken legs in the woods.

5. Officers continue patrols of the schools, and YEAA Basketball games.
6. Grant paid related traffic enforcement details continue in high violation incident areas.
7. Yeadon Police Chaplaincy Program training planned for February 25-26, 2019.
8. A new Yeadon Police Website is being prepared for unveiling soon.
9. Active Shooter/Killer instruction refreshers for Yeadon's schools have begun again.
10. Met with members of the Mt Moriah Cemetery to work on prevention of dumping and vandalism on the Yeadon side of the property.
  - a. Stealth cameras that transmit photos to my phone are being purchased to help identify and deter potential unlawful activity.

**Police Training.**

1. Mandatory In-Service Training, as well as other training continues which includes:
  - a. Mandatory In-Service Training required for maintaining status as a Police Officer.
  - b. Firearms and Rifle requalifications.
  - c. First Aid/CPR.
  - d. DUI Checkpoint Re-certs.
  - e. SWAT training (Firearms, Entry Tactics, etc.)
2. Child Abuse Investigation Training
3. Advanced Active Shooter/Killer Training
4. Crime Scene Training for Officers is scheduled.
5. Firearms Instructor and Recertification Course scheduled.

Training is a vital aspect of a professional police agency, and ongoing education and training will be afforded officers to promote officer development and a quality of service to the public second to none.

**Recruitment, Hiring, Promotional Examinations**

1. Interviews for Part-Time Police Officer positions are currently are in progress again.
2. Interviews for crossing guards are being conducted.
3. Discussions with the Public Safety Committee on promotional and police officer testing changes to the Civil Service Rules are ongoing.

### **"Cam Saw It!"**

#### ***Policy & Terms of Use***

***Policy:*** Registration is voluntary and there is no cost associated with this program or registration. Registering your information and camera system does not provide Yeadon Police or any other Law Enforcement Agency with direct access to your camera(s) or system. All information on this form will be kept confidential by the Yeadon Police unless subject to disclosure by a court order. Your information will be accessed by Yeadon Police who are investigating criminal activity, who may contact you to request a copy of any video captured by your camera, which may assist in a criminal investigation.

***Terms of Use:*** The goal of this program is to deter crime and promote public safety through a partnership between Yeadon Police and our community we serve and protect. In furtherance of that goal, all CSI registrants agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. The registrant must be the owner of the property/system registered or an authorized tenant of the property with approval of the property owner, or the owner of the business or authorized lessor of the business establishment with the approval of the business location owner.
2. If necessary, Yeadon Police will contact you directly to request your help in reviewing your footage or in obtaining the appropriate video surveillance footage your system may have captured.
3. Any footage containing or related to criminal activity may be collected by Yeadon Police for use as evidence during any stage of a criminal proceeding at no cost to the registrant, and Yeadon Police will provide the necessary media for downloading or saving the footage for investigative purposes.
4. Under no circumstances shall registrants construe that they are acting as an agent and/or employee of Yeadon Borough, Yeadon Police, or any other Law Enforcement agency through the program.
5. If, in the future you decide to rescind this registration, Yeadon Police will honor that request and remove your registration from the program.
6. A future sale or new ownership of your residence or business does not carry this agreement over with the new owners, who must register as a new CSI partner if they desire to participate in this program.
