Dear Mayor Hepkins:

It is my pleasure to present to you and Council the Police Department's Monthly Report for the services performed by the members of the Yeadon Police Department for March 1-31, 2019.

**General Information.** Information is a vital part of being able to provide answers to residents that can help others understand the dynamics of law enforcement, activities that occur daily to make a community safe, as well as associated costs dynamic to public safety. This reflects the work of the personnel in the Department, which includes police, parking enforcement, clerical staff, and school crossing guards.

### Crime Prevention.

- **#MissionLockItUp** and the **CSI or 'Cam Saw It' Camera Program** continue to generate interest and participation in the Borough and nearby jurisdictions.
- Plainclothes patrols are occurring in the Borough.
- Walk-thru of schools and sporting events continues.
- Public speaking engagements with youth to offer safety tips and anti-violence tips.
- Safety tips and public interaction continues with Nextdoor.
- In discussions with a Crime Mapping Company to bring this dynamic to Yeadon residents while keeping costs down for the program to maintain quality control of budget usage.

**Safety Tip: Feral/Stray Cats, Dogs, and Wildlife.** I thought I'd take the time to address an issue in the Borough that some create because they care about animals. While your intentions of leaving food out for strays might seem humane and caring please consider the following that results from such activities.

1. Potential for the spread of disease increases as different animals share food and water.
2. Raccoons that are notorious for rabies are attracted as well as other wildlife, which may risk you, others, and pets for infection from a bite or feces related bacteria left by strays or wild animals. Raccoons are suffering from what appears to be a distemper outbreak in the area.
  - a. This can be transmitted to dogs and cats.
  - b. Symptoms are stumbling, lethargic activity, and potential death if not treated.
3. Unchecked populations of animals can escalate to the point urine odors; feces, etc. can overwhelm your home, neighbors' homes, and create physically offensive conditions that affect quality of life for all.
4. Costs associated with collection of animals that create problems costs you and the Borough substantial funds. For example each stray cat costs about \$300 to remove, while stray dogs cost about \$450.00. Wildlife costs are in the \$400-500 range per incident (raccoons, skunks, opossums, etc.).

So my advice is to please stop leaving food out. There are no kill shelters available to the public, and you can trap these animals and turn them over to a shelter where they can be properly cared for, and you in the long run with your neighbors are safer.

Based on a review of the areas that present repeated problems, complaints from the public, or officers and/or my observations, directed traffic patrols will be continued for resident, pedestrian, and motorists safety. Major violations continue to revolve around stop sign violations and speed, especially school zones.

**Non-Traffic Citations issued: 12**

The most common offense for the month was disorderly conduct.

**Police Department Activity.**

1. The Adult Citizens Police Academy is in full swing.
  - a. During a ride-along participants witnessed a drug delivery arrest, and a heroin user stopped from using in a secluded area.
  - b. Classes end April 17 with graduation certificates to be presented at the April 18 Council Meeting.
2. Officers continue patrols of the schools, and YEAA Basketball games.
3. Grant paid related traffic enforcement details continue in high violation incident areas.
4. The new contest for students "Chief for a Day" is out to the schools. The contest involves positive acts and interactions with officers.
  - a. Students or parents can post positive pics with the #YeadonPDContest for a chance to win.
5. A new contest for adults is in the works so they too can experience a day in the life as a Chief.
6. I changed up "Coffee with a Cop". Yeadon now has the first ever program of its kind.
  - a. **"OPERATION HOUSE-CALL"**. Through this program, I alert residents when I am free on patrol, and they can text to have me stop by and meet with them in person to discuss matters or just say hello.
  - b. My thought was to offer a chance for residents who might not be able to get places on their own.
  - c. I come to them.

7. Active Killer (shooter) training is planned for the Library staff in May.
  8. Attended the Public Safety Meeting.
  9. Spoke at the YEAA Championship games about police, youth, and the public.
  10. Spoke to students of Philadelphia Community College about Human Services and Policing careers.
  11. Officers spoke to the local Yeadon Cub Scouts about safety.
  12. Officers read short stories to classes at Bell and Evans.
  13. Work with Federal US Marshalls is ongoing.

**Police Training.**

1. Mandatory In-Service Training, as well as other training continues which includes:
  - a. Mandatory In-Service Training required for maintaining status as a Police Officer.
  - a. Firearms and Rifle requalifications continue.
  - b. First Aid/CPR refreshers for officers as needed.
  - c. SWAT training (Firearms, Entry Tactics, etc.)
2. Advanced Active Shooter/Killer Training continues.
3. Crime Scene Training for Officers starts April 8, 2019.
4. Inter-County Detective School scheduled now for May 2019.
5. Firearms Instructor and Recertification Course starts April 8, 2019.
6. Officers attended Autism Training.
7. Officers attended Facial Recognition Program Training.

Training is a vital aspect of a professional police agency, and ongoing education and training will be afforded officers to promote officer development and a quality of service to the public second to none.

**Recruitment, Hiring, Promotional Examinations**

1. Proposal and work on part-time Animal Control Officer costs and associated expenses continue.
2. Id like to float the idea that Yeadon Borough should consider developing an animal shelter for Delaware County to support not only our issues, but recovery of costs associated with Animal Control.
3. The need for additional part-time officers continues and plans are in the works to request Council to approve 4 new part time officers possibly by May.
