Dear Mayor Hepkins:

It is my pleasure to present to you and Council the Police Department's Monthly Report for the services performed by the members of the Yeadon Police Department for May 01-31, 2019.

**General Information.** Information is a vital part of being able to provide answers to residents that can help others understand the dynamics of law enforcement, activities that occur daily to make a community safe, as well as associated costs dynamic to public safety. This reflects the work of the personnel in the Department, which includes police, parking enforcement, clerical staff, and school crossing guards.

### Crime Prevention.

- **#MissionLockItUp** and the **CSI or 'Cam Saw It' Camera Program** continue to generate interest and participation in the Borough and nearby jurisdictions.
- Plainclothes patrols are occurring in the Borough.
- Vacation Safety Tips have been posted on Nextdoor.
- Vacant Property Checks are being offered to residents going away.
- Safety tips and public interaction continues with Nextdoor.
- Added patrols during inclement weather, when an upsurge in area vehicle thefts occurs is in effect.
- Increase to platoons using part time officers is currently being done to bolster summer patrols.

**Safety Tip: Vacation Time!** So I'm on patrol and happen by a resident who is loading their car in the middle of the street headed to the airport for a vacation. Here is some advice to help you keep your home safe while you're away.

- DONT ADVERTISE YOU'RE GOING AWAY!!!!
- Consider loading up your car under cover of darkness to avoid letting potential burglars and thieves know you're going away. Then in the morning you all get in and head out to your destination.
- Tell a trusted neighbor to keep an eye out and/or collect your mail if you haven't had the Post Office put a hold on your mail.
- Make sure your grass is cut.
- Leave a light on or on timers in different parts of the home.
- Unplug appliances that don't need to be plugged in while you're away.
- Check all windows, make sure they are locked. LOCK UP! And overnight remember to #MissionLockItUp your car, and luggage that won't fit in the trunk, load that when you're ready to roll in the morning.
- ALERT your local police who will make checks. While we can't prevent every burglary with this check, and all of these tips, the more we think about and act on taking steps to prevent crime, the better chance we have of avoiding it.
- HAVE A GREAT VACATION when you do go, and be safe!

**Traffic Citations issued: 44**

Based on a review of the areas that present repeated problems, complaints from the public, or officers and/or my observations, directed traffic patrols will be continued for resident, pedestrian, and motorists safety. Major violations continue to revolve around stop sign violations and speed, especially school zones.

**Non-Traffic Citations issued: 11**

The most common offense for the month was disorderly conduct and public intoxication.

**Police Department Activity.**

1. Five (5) Officers completed Inter-County Detective School.
  - a. As of this Month, about 90% of the Department is trained in Investigative Techniques.
2. Grant paid related traffic enforcement details continue in high violation incident areas.
3. **"OPERATION HOUSE-CALL"** continues. Through this program, I alert residents when I am free on patrol, and they can text to have me stop by and meet with them in person to discuss matters or just say hello. Several residents have used this program, which continues to generate positive comments for the Borough.
4. Active Killer (shooter) training is being rescheduled for the Library staff as the date conflicted with the Election.
5. Work with the US Marshalls and Drug Task Force continues.
6. The Clergy program continues to make Yeadon shine. They have been an integral assistance in the recent Tomah death investigation, and participated in the funeral and services with the family. I am truly humbled and proud of them.
7. DUI Checkpoint was held on May 3, 2019 and yielded numerous DUIs, and other arrests including firearms violations.
8. Several Policies have been revised or created and this is ongoing as I review the Policies.
  - a. Firearms Policy
  - b. Uniform Policy
  - c. Tattoo Policy
  - d. Personal Appearance Policy
9. General Orders related to operational aspects of the department are ongoing, and documented.

10. Spoke to students at the Cypress campus about Law Enforcement Careers.
11. Numerous students have requested applications for the next Youth Police Academy scheduled for September 2019.
12. Met with the Civil Service Commission to update the Civil Service Rules to allow amongst some changes, a wider radius from Yeadon to allow more potential candidates to participate in the selection process.
13. Active Killer (Shooter) presentation scheduled for Arthur Gallagher Insurance Company that represents the Borough on June 7, 2019.
14. Officers were detailed for a Community Day along Church Lane.
15. I attended the Comcast Cares Day initiative.
16. Work with Public Works continues to address illegal dumping.
17. Flag Day preparations were addressed.

---

**Police Training.**

1. Mandatory In-Service Training, as well as other training continues which includes:
  - a. Mandatory In-Service Training (ACT 180) required for maintaining status as a Police Officer.
  - a. Firearms and Rifle requalifications continue.
  - b. First Aid/CPR refreshers for officers as needed.
  - c. SWAT training (Firearms, Entry Tactics, etc.)
2. Officers attended Inter-County Crime Information Sharing Meetings.
3. Officers attended Criminal Justice Information training.
4. An Officer attended TOP GUN training which is a much sought after Narcotics Training Program.
5. An Officer is being trained in Advanced Accident Reconstruction, and has attended 2 schools towards this endeavor.
6. Officers received ongoing legal updates as they affect policing, which include search and seizure, evidence collection, interrogations, juvenile arrests/detentions, and pursuit issues.

Training is a vital aspect of a professional police agency, and ongoing education and training will be afforded officers to promote officer development and a quality of service to the public second to none.
