Dear Mayor Hepkins:

It is my pleasure to present to you and Council the Police Department's Monthly Report for the services performed by the members of the Yeadon Police Department for June 01-30, 2019.

General Information. Information is a vital part of being able to provide answers to residents that can help others understand the dynamics of law enforcement, activities that occur daily to make a community safe, as well as associated costs dynamic to public safety. This reflects the work of the personnel in the Department, which includes police, parking enforcement, clerical staff, and school crossing guards.

Crime Prevention.

- #MissionLockItUp, 'Cam Saw It' Camera Program, and #Operation House-Call continue to generate interest and participation in the Borough.
- Plainclothes patrols are occurring in the Borough.
- Vacant Property Checks continue for residents going away.
- Safety tips and public interaction continues with Nextdoor.
- Added patrols during inclement weather, when an upsurge in area vehicle thefts occurs is in effect.
- Increase to platoons using part time officers is currently being done to bolster summer patrols, and the added patrols are effective in reducing crime and response times for calls for service.

Safety Tip: FIREWORKS. Tis the season anymore thanks to PA legalizing SOME fireworks. Only fireworks purchased in legally run stores in the State provide items that can legally be used by civilians. Now for the bad news. They are dangerous still. Yeadon Borough's Code states the following:

§ 160-5 Consumer fireworks.

A person who is at least 18 years or age may purchase, possess, or use consumer fireworks in the Borough of Yeadon, except:

A. No person may intentionally ignite or discharge consumer fireworks in the Borough of Yeadon on Borough property, including Borough-owned streets, parks, or facilities without the express written permission of the Borough;

B. No person shall utilize consumer fireworks within 150 feet of any occupied structure;

C. No person shall utilize consumer fireworks or sparkling devices while under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug;

D. No person shall utilize consumer fireworks or sparkling devices within, or throw consumer fireworks or sparkling devices from a moving vehicle or building or at another person.

§ 160-6 Violations and penalties.

A. A person using consumer fireworks in violation of the provisions of this article commits a summary offense, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 for each use of consumer fireworks.

B. A person using display fireworks without a Borough-issued permit commits a summary offense, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$600 for each use of display fireworks.

SO, please refrain from their use, as there is no legal area within the Borough that permits use of fireworks. An Occupied Structure does not mean that someone is home, and if they are not, you can use them. An "Occupied structure" is any structure, vehicle or place adapted for overnight accommodation of persons, or for carrying on business therein, whether or not a person is actually present. BE SAFE!!

Traffic Citations issued: 38

Based on a review of the areas that present repeated problems, complaints from the public, or officers and/or my observations, directed traffic patrols will be continued for resident, pedestrian, and motorists safety. Major violations continue to revolve around stop sign violations and speed, especially school zones.

The most common offense for the month was disorderly conduct.

Police Department Activity.

1. Sgt. Johnson commanded the Department during my absence mid-June.
 2. Flag Day festivities occurred with much fanfare and no issues that deflected from the event.
 3. Grant paid related traffic enforcement details continue in high violation incident areas.
 4. **"OPERATION HOUSE-CALL"** continues
 5. Work with the US Marshalls and Drug Task Force continues.
 6. The Clergy program continues to make Yeadon shine.
 7. General Orders related to operational aspects of the department are ongoing, and documented.
 8. Active Killer (Shooter) presentation for Arthur Gallagher Insurance Company that represents the Borough was conducted on June 7, 2019.
 9. Yeadon Police assisted with a Car show at Mt Moriah Cemetery.
 10. Officers attended Inter-County Crime Information Sharing Meetings.
 11. Yeadon has registered for National Night Out Tuesday, August 6, 2019.

Police Training.

1. Mandatory In-Service Training, as well as other training continues which includes:
 - a. Mandatory In-Service Training (ACT 180) required for maintaining status as a Police Officer.
 - a. Firearms and Rifle requalifications continue.
 - b. First Aid/CPR refreshers for officers as needed.
 - c. SWAT training (Firearms, Entry Tactics, etc.)
2. Ofc. Nick Tokonitz successfully completed TOP GUN training a much sought after Narcotics Training Program.
3. Officers received ongoing legal updates as they affect policing, which include search and seizure, evidence collection, interrogations, juvenile arrests/detentions, and pursuit issues.
4. ERT SWAT Team has paid for new equipment for SWAT officers – Patrol Rifles valued at \$2500.00. Thank you Region 1.
5. Yearly we pay a \$1500.00 team fee, but as you can see with just this one equipment purchase we have benefited greatly by our relationship and participation with the Regions SWAT Team, a vital asset to policing and the community.

Training is a vital aspect of a professional police agency, and ongoing education and training will be afforded officers to promote officer development and a quality of service to the public second to none.

Recruitment, Hiring, Promotional Examinations

1. Interviews being conducted for:
 - a. Part Time Police
 - b. Crossing Guards
2. Work continues on Civil Services matters for hiring of full time Police Officers. Hoping to post a test by August, and with the process to prepare a final list, looking for potential new patrol officers, and promotions to occur in January to avoid any budget issues this year.
