Dear Mayor Hepkins:

It is my pleasure to present to you and Council the Police Department's Monthly Report for the services performed by the members of the Yeadon Police Department for November 01-30, 2019.

General Information. Information is a vital part of being able to provide answers to residents that can help others understand the dynamics of law enforcement, activities that occur daily to make a community safe, as well as associated costs dynamic to public safety. This reflects the work of the personnel in the Department, which includes police, parking enforcement, clerical staff, and school crossing guards.

Crime Prevention.

- #MissionLockItUp, 'Cam Saw It' Camera Program, and #Operation House-Call continue.
- Plainclothes patrols continue.
- Safety tips and public interaction continues on Nextdoor.
- Use of public safety signage and vehicles in use to deter crime and traffic violations continue.

Safety Tip: Tis the season. It's the season that thieves are window shopping more than ever. So use this tip to not only protect yourself after you get home by keeping up with #MissionLockItUp, but remember while out don't broadcast what you've bought at stores and then place it in the back seat or open back area of any vehicle to continue shopping. A thief may be sitting in a vehicle in the parking lot where you are shopping waiting to get their hands on your purchases. Place them in the trunk when you know you're not being observed. Park your vehicle with the trunk exposed to the traffic lane and not backed into a spot against another vehicle which may shield someone forcing your trunk open to get the stuff you just stored there. Main point here is to be aware of your surroundings. Look as you're walking and don't be paranoid about it, but be aware of who is around, who is sitting in a car watching, because your safety and security depends on it. Be safe and have a wonderful holiday!

Deer Season: The last season has had a significant effect on deer movement and population from what I have seen this year. Thus far this year approved archery hunting has harvested 4 Bucks and 16 Does, with 3 does removed from the herd as a result of traffic incidents, and one buck as a result of illegal hunting discovered by approved hunters in the woods. If you see hunters, please don't hesitate to call 610-623-1500 and provide information related to what you see. Officers will check. The purpose of approved hunters is to ensure no one is hunting with unapproved weapons, and that the individuals have permission to be where they are. The illegal hunting was occurring in Mt. Moriah on the Philly side, and hunters trespassed not only there which is illegal, but then trespassed into the Borough without authorization. The goal is herd reduction, public safety, and feeding those who might benefit from the program. For those involved or benefiting from this program, thank you for your support.

 - i. A Juvenile Petition is an arrest of a juvenile offender that results in a Criminal Record being generated. A Petition is for a felony or misdemeanor offense, which the juvenile has been charged with, and the District Attorney has reviewed and approved related charges.

Traffic Citations issued: 91

Based on a review of the areas that present repeated problems, complaints from the public, or officers and/or my observations, directed traffic patrols will be continued for resident, pedestrian, and motorists safety. Major violations continue to revolve around stop sign violations and speed, especially school zones. A large portion of traffic activity is grant funded, with in-kind enforcement during regular patrols to support the efforts. Additionally, Yeadon Police have been recognized as the leader in DELCO for State traffic enforcement, and I am proud of the efforts of the officers that helped earn this distinction.

Non-Traffic Citations issued: 13

The most common offense for the month was disorderly conduct.

Police Department Activity.

1. Grant paid related traffic enforcement details continue in high violation incident areas.
2. **"OPERATION HOUSE-CALL"** continues, as well as other initiated programs for residents.
3. Work with the US Marshalls and Drug Task Force continues.
 - a. Drug Forfeitures and Task Force reimbursements help alleviate police department costs for equipment, OT, and public safety endeavors.
4. The Clergy are now recognized by the Law Enforcement Chaplains of Delaware County organization.
5. General Orders related to computer usage are in effect.
 - a. Efforts to prevent an attack on our computer systems from subjects using ransomware. Recently a Delaware County Police Agency lost all of its data in such an attack.
6. Policy development and writing continues with policies currently being reviewed, updated, and/or created.
7. Various intersections are being repainted to designate stop locations, and provide some visual calming devices for motorists in an effort to reduce speed and traffic violations.
8. Signage in various locations has been updated to reduce driver confusion at problem locations.
9. Officers participated in a recent DUI checkpoint which is funded through State grants.

10. Police Department is working with a Federal grant liaison to acquire funding for police related expenses for 2020.
 11. Officers have made outstanding arrests removing several illegal firearms and drugs during traffic stops during the month.
 12. 2020 will bring a new format to the Monthly Police Report with new information and crime mapping.

Police Training.

1. Mandatory In-Service Training, as well as other training continues which includes:
 - a. Mandatory In-Service Training required for maintaining status as a Police Officer.
 - a. Firearms, Rifle requalifications, and First Aid/CPR training continues for officers.
 - b. SWAT training (Firearms, Entry Tactics, Woodland Tactics, etc.)
2. All of this training has been completed by officers to remain current with their certifications.
3. Officers have been training in updated CLEAN and State regulated information systems requirements to retain our ORI status with the State to ensure our ability to use State Computer Systems such as JNET and CLEAN.

Training is a vital aspect of a professional police agency, and ongoing education and training will be afforded officers to promote officer development and a quality of service to the public second to none. Furthermore, a failure to train can result in a Federal Lawsuit award, should a plaintiff show the Department failed to provide training to officers to keep them aware of and in line with current practices and police service protocols.

Recruitment, Hiring, Promotional Examinations

1. 139 Applications went out for the entry exam.
2. 43 were returned.
3. 39 Showed for the testing and physical agility.
4. 4 failed the Physical Agility.
5. 2 Failed the exam.
6. As of Friday, all 33 interviews will be completed and the results will be forwarded to the Civil Service Commission for review no later than Tuesday, December 17, 2019.
7. 6 Local Chiefs of Police assisted in the interview process. I will be writing letters thanking them at the conclusion of the interviews, and will publicly name them during the January 2020 meeting. In an effort to keep the interviews integrity, I will not name them in this report.
8. 6 Officers tested for Sergeant, and 2 Sergeants tested for Lieutenant. Those results will be forwarded to the Commission as well for review, with the results from the patrol interviews. All supervisors passed the written examinations.
9. Thank you to the Mayor, Council, Borough Solicitor and Management Team, and the Civil Service Commission who have supported this endeavor. I appreciate your trust and confidence in this process, and look forward to the benefits promotions and new hires in the police department will bring to the community and our public safety mission.
