## William Penn School District - Superintendent of Schools Position Update

The William Penn Board of School Directors is pleased to announce that the search for the district's next Superintendent has reached its final phase.

The Board began the search process in August 2019, by conducting a community survey and focus groups to determine what District stakeholders were looking for in their new superintendent and engaged the superintendent subcommittee for input into this process. The community responded with their opinions, goals, and priorities for the role. The Board then conducted a comprehensive search process facilitated by the Delaware County Intermediate Unit (DCIU) and guided by the community's feedback. Of the 48 applications that were received, 12 were selected by the search committee for initial interviews. Six candidates advanced to the second round, and two to the final round.

At this time, the Board is pleased to announce **Dr. Eric J. Becoats** as the finalist candidate for the position of Superintendent of Schools for the William Penn School District. He has been chosen to succeed retiring Superintendent Ms. Jane Harbert.

The Board intends to name Dr. Eric J. Becoats to this position at its regularly scheduled school board meeting on February 24, 2020 subject to the execution of a mutually- acceptable Contract of Employment. The meeting will be held in the William Penn School District Administrative Building, 100 Green Avenue, Lansdowne, PA 19050 at 7:30pm (pre-session beginning at 6:30pm). The Board thanks the community for its involvement in this important process.
