## Police Training

- ✓ Officers received instruction on Exculpatory Evidence, with a Policy being developed to keep us in the forefront of the Law Enforcement Community.
- ✓ Officer Involved Shooting Protocols in conjunction with the new DA Task Force Response is now in place here in Yeadon, as well as the rest of Delaware County.
- ✓ Supervisors continue daily roll call trainings and briefings with officers.
- ✓ Supervisors have completed “Bulletproof Leadership” Training.
- ✓ Officers have completed all required training pursuant to State Mandates for 2020.
