COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT ANNUAL HEARING
December 17, 2020**

Hearing began at 7:00 p.m.

- I. CALL TO ORDER (Council President LaToya Monroe)
- II. EXPLANATION OF HEARING BY ENGINEER – Eileen Mulvena
 - a. This hearing is being held to receive public inquiry into the selection of projects Council is applying for through the Community Block grant funding from County Council.
 - b. The application is due January 6th.
 - c. The Borough can pick two (2) projects. One project will be considered priority and the second project will be the alternate. Only low to moderate income areas are eligible for the grants.
- III. DISCUSSION - There was discussion regarding previous and new projects to be considered.
 - a. Sanitary sewer replacement on Cypress Street between Longacre Boulevard and Baily Road. Mrs. Mulvena noted that the sanitary sewer is in poor condition. This project is located within the northwest quadrant of the Borough which is an eligible area. NDI recommends applying for funding in this area.
 - b. Replacement of three (3) manholes on the 400 Block of Holly Road. Mrs. Mulvena is concerned that the project from manhole #1 to manhole #2, which is the northmost manhole down to the next manhole, cannot wait for the County's approval because the project will not start until the fall. NDI recommends performing work on the manhole #1 and manhole #2 using Borough funds and apply for the grant for manhole #2 to manhole #3 (manhole to the south manhole at the end of the block). The Borough can submit two (2) projects and the County will decide whether to approve one or both projects.

IV. CITIZENS FORUM (Open to the public for citizens to suggest projects in the Borough)

- a. Councilor Cave asked if by requesting two projects will the County approve both or will they only approve one.

Mrs. Mulvena answered there is always a chance that the County will approve both projects. The Cypress Street project is expensive. Last years estimate was \$328,000 with \$100,000 contributed by the Borough. She is unsure if the County will consider two projects with the Cypress Street project being so expensive. The Holly Road project is estimated at approximately \$200,000.

Mrs. Mulvena noted the County grant is approximately 2 million dollars and is split between about 38 communities and covers non-profits as well.
