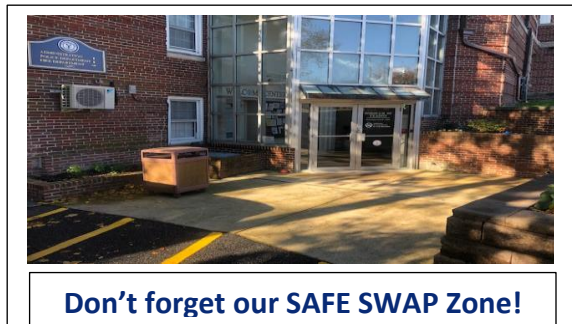

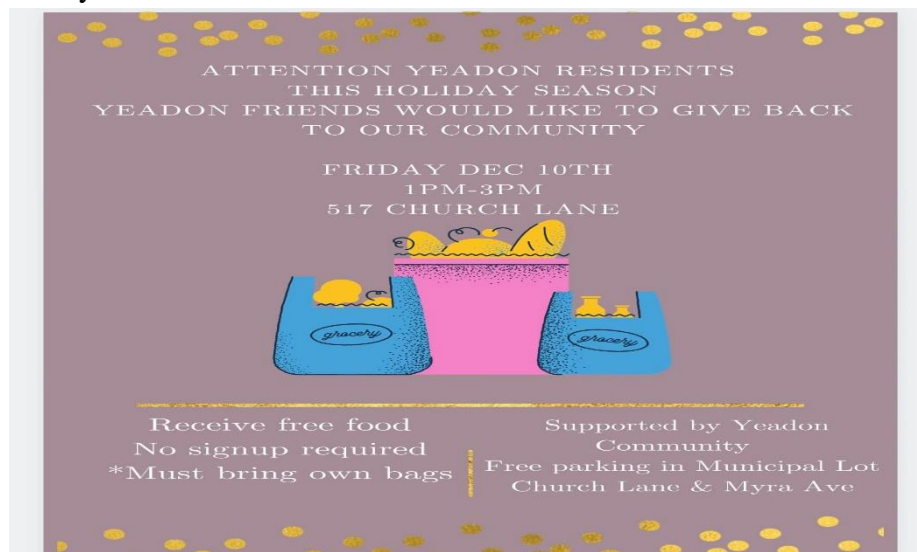

## Crime Alert

Philadelphia and the County are getting swamped with catalytic converter thefts. I talked about this earlier this year and gave some tips as well, and its happening again, so please read this to help protect yourself from this crime. If you own a pickup, hybrid vehicle, an SUV, A Toyota, Honda, Lexus, U-haul or large pickup, take some steps to help deter this crime. It takes, in some cases especially if you have a high clearance vehicle just seconds to take it off with a portable saw.

### So think about.....

- Parking your car in a well-lit area.
- Parking your car most often with the exhaust side against the curb, wall, or another car to limit space access to the underneath of your car.
- If you a high clearance vehicle use a low clearance vehicle to block it.
- Paint the catalytic convertor with high temp paint a bright orange or other color that will stand out and it might make the thief avoid it cause it they realize some are doing this to deter these thefts.
- Install motion lights or an alarm in your driveway.
- They make alarms that go off if you car is tilted (jacked up by the thief) consider installing this.
- When parking in a public lot, use stationary objects in the lot to help deter access to the exhaust system (a wall, a pole, another car).
- Park near a camera that thieves can see, which might deter this.
- You can ask your mechanic to weld it to the car.
- Listen, yes listen for sounds of power tools when your home as stupid as that sounds. Look out and see what it is. You might catch a thief in the act.
- Call 911 immediately because this crime in some cases especially when there is no need to lift the car, seconds to complete.
- Note unusual cars in your neighborhood, especially a vehicle even a u-haul that seems to be driving too slowly or circles your block, they may be looking for or at a particular car to target.
- See someone under a car, around the exhaust area, and no tools other than a jack and handheld power saw.

Don't hesitate to call 911, let us check things out, sometimes just us driving through can deter the crime. You can avoid being a victim, and if you are, don't forget to check your car insurance for parts coverage, and most of all make a police report. BELOW are pics of some devices to use to deter this crime.
