IV. MAYOR'S REPORT

The Mayor asked that his report be accepted as submitted and updated the citizens on the following:

- 3. Yeadon Borough saw a significant decrease in crime when compared to surrounding areas and did so while staying under budget.
- 4. The Mayor expressed high praise for the Police Chief's leadership.

VI. MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Dotson thanked the residents for attending the meeting and expressed his interest in working with all department heads and specifically mentioned the Engineer in securing grants for the Borough. Mr. Dotson gave a detailed report of his activities since becoming the Borough Manager. Discussed registering Yeadon as a participant/recipient with National Opioid billion-dollar settlement that will bring \$253 million to Delaware County. Mr. Dotson expressed high praise for the Public Works Dept. Applied CBD grant in the amount of \$184K of which the Borough is responsible for a match of \$49K.

VII. TAX COLLECTOR

Yolonda Hughes, Esq. asked all residents to make sure that they pay their tax bill when it comes.

VIII. ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Viscuso discussed his firms municipal experience representing over 125 municipalities all over the east coast. From that perspective his firm brings a wide array of solutions to the Borough. Mr. Viscuso stated that he is a licensed engineer and surveyor and adjunct professor at Widner University. In closing, I would like to mention that last year our firm was able to secure over \$25 million in grants for municipalities.

Discussed significant decrease in crime in the Borough especially when compared to surrounding areas. Gave several anecdotes of police interactions with residents throughout the Borough. Thanked residents for their support.

Rufus Stokes Summary: In constant contact with Delaware Co Emergency Management. Summary on pandemic development. Information sent out this month to all members of council in reference to advanced training - National Incident Management System, that is required by law, through FEMA.
